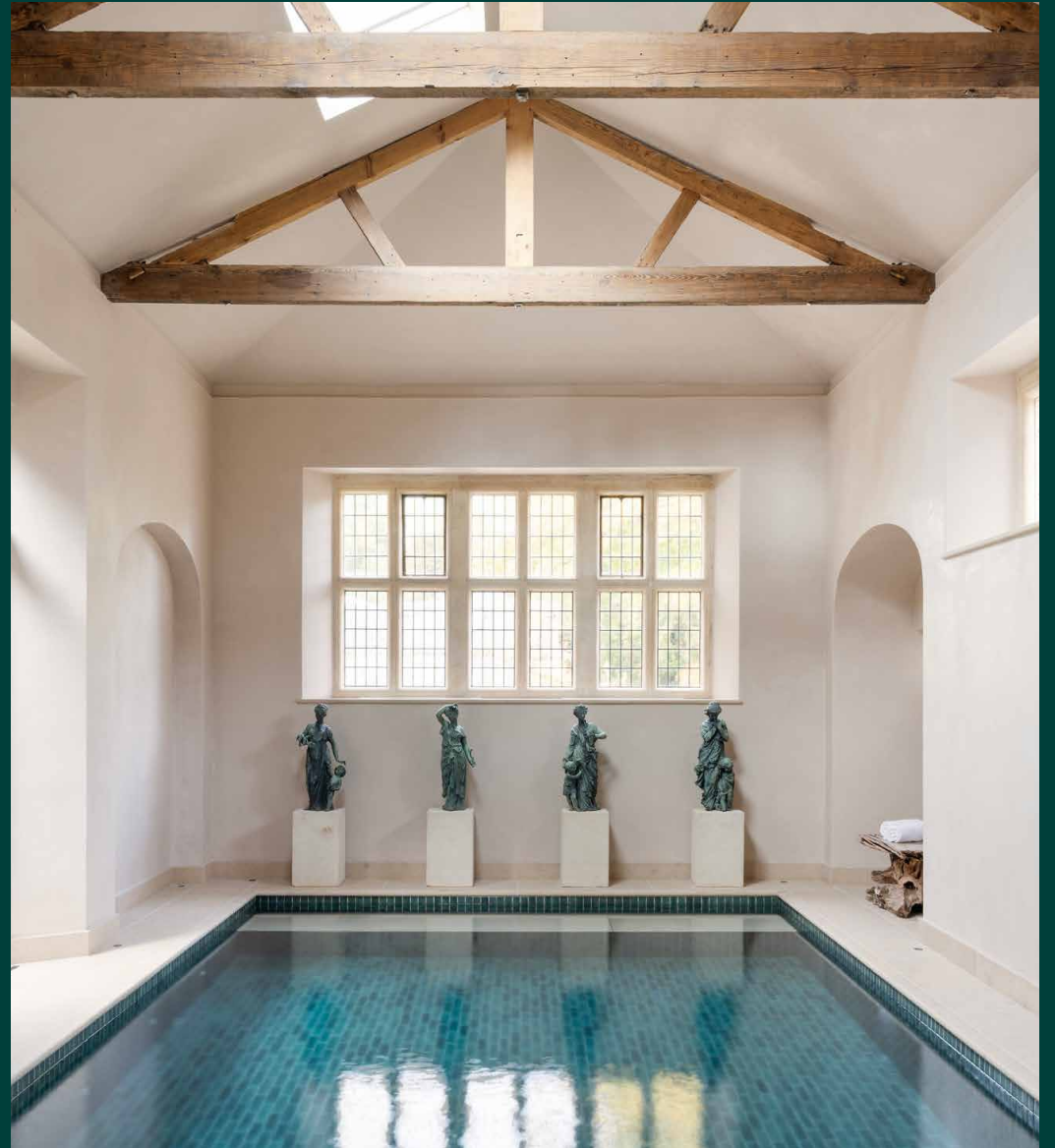

The handsome seven-bedroom house reveals itself amid 80 acres of pastoral countryside. From the Jacobean Great Hall to the Georgian south wing and puginesque billiards room, this grand manor house is testament to the enduring quality of exceptional design. Brought into modern day by its new owner and Simon Morray-Jones Architects, it offers a serene elegance and exceptional comfort in a charming Cotswolds vernacular. Across the expansive estate, enjoy convivial gatherings in grand reception rooms, with staff on hand to attend to your every wish.





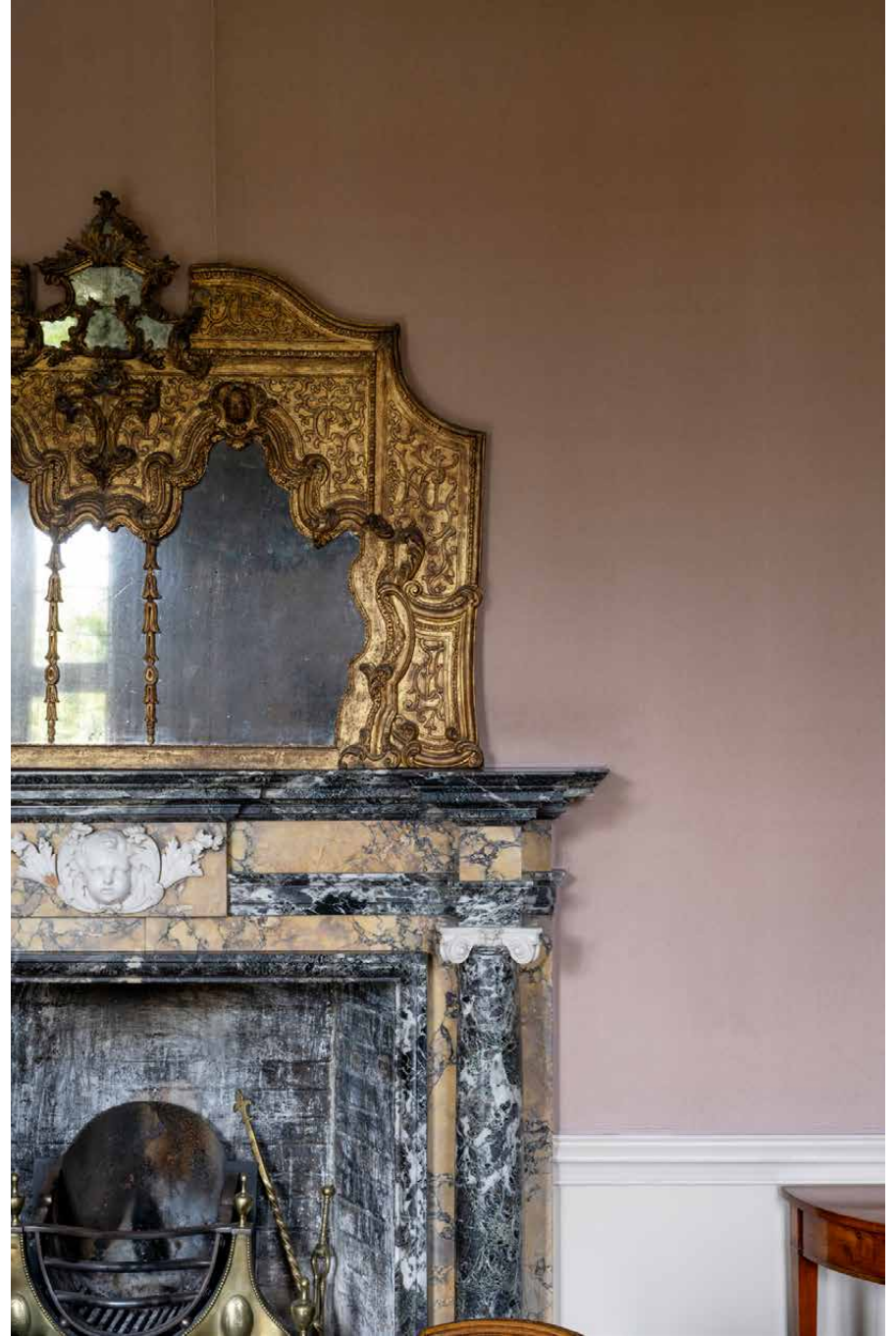
The living spaces

At the heart of the house lies the magnificent Great Hall – a masterpiece of Jacobean craftsmanship, where richly carved oak panelling and a finely moulded ceiling create what historian Nicholas Kingsley once described as “one of the most perfect early-17th-century interiors in the country”.

Beyond this grand centrepiece, the formal drawing room lies bathed in sun, the French doors opening to a south-facing terrace overlooking the parterre garden. Walls clad in muted rose velvet rise to meet ornate cornicing, while delicate chandeliers illuminate silk upholstery and marble-topped furniture. The library continues the theme – its decorative ceiling panels and fabric-clad walls create a tranquil space, lined with well-loved volumes and antique cabinetry – a secret silver screen a treasure to uncover for cinephiles.







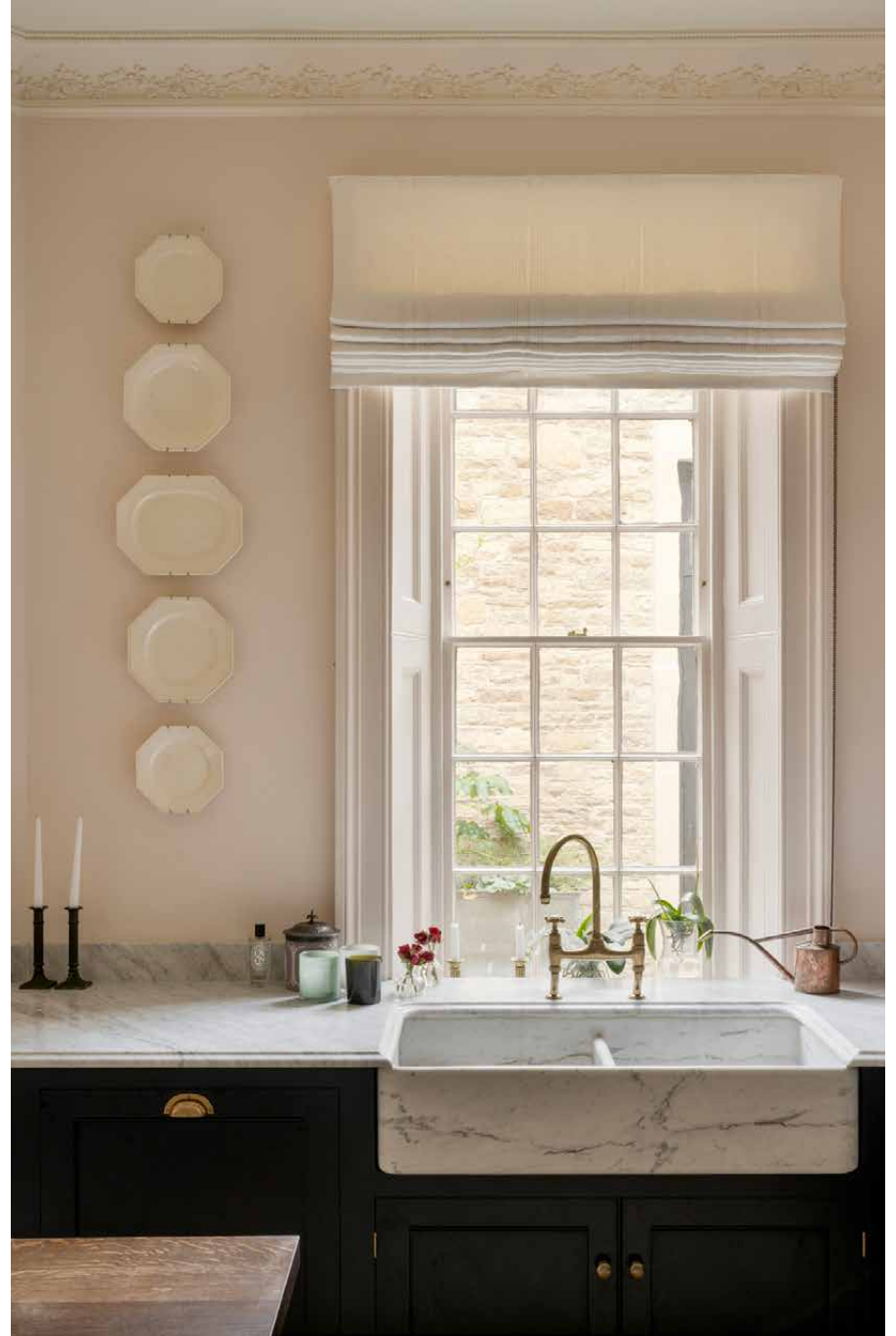






Kitchen & dining

A seamless conversation between classic and contemporary, the bespoke DeVol kitchen is an uplifting setting for culinary creativity – with a chef on-hand to cater for all occasions. High ceilings amplify the sense of space, while pale pink and black tones introduce a modern feel. An iconic feature of English countryside cooking, the Aga oven, keeps things cosy throughout the year. There's also a large wine fridge and direct access to the romantic courtyard, a perfect spot for an alfresco lunch by the fountain.









In the dining room, a refined interplay of old and new unfolds. A collection of porcelain Famille Rose plates, acquired at Christie's, provides a delicate counterpoint to the room's architectural panelling and modern art pieces. At its centre stands an elliptical table, which adds a sense of occasion to intimate dinners and formal entertaining. The adjoining breakfast room exudes charm, its walls adorned with custom chinoiserie wallpaper by Allyson McDermott, inspired by her restoration work at Brighton Pavilion. Antique furniture and carved stone fireplaces anchor these rooms with warmth and timeless elegance.



Outdoor spaces

Evocative and tranquil, the grounds at Ampney Park put you at one with nature – meander along paths beneath ancient trees, trickling streams and expansive lakes. Each season brings its own captivating appeal: spring blossoms, summer light, autumn's golden canopy, and winter's serene stillness. Much like the interior, custom artistry is present throughout the gardens – from intricate ironmongery by local Cirencester artisans at Donkeywell Forge to bespoke solid oak gates by Chiselworks.







Bedrooms & bathrooms

The sleeping quarters unfold as a series of distinct spaces, each defined by its own palette of materials and colours. Sophia sets the tone with its custom four-poster bed and walls wrapped in floral fabric, creating a cocooned, tactile environment. The adjoining en suite bathroom enjoys a large walk-in shower, complemented by green marble and gilded accents. Across the landing, Rosie introduces a handcrafted sensibility: painted trompe l'oeil murals by Rosie Mennem frame a four-poster bed with Hästens mattresses. A private lounge leads to the en suite bathroom, containing a walk-in shower and a deep tub.

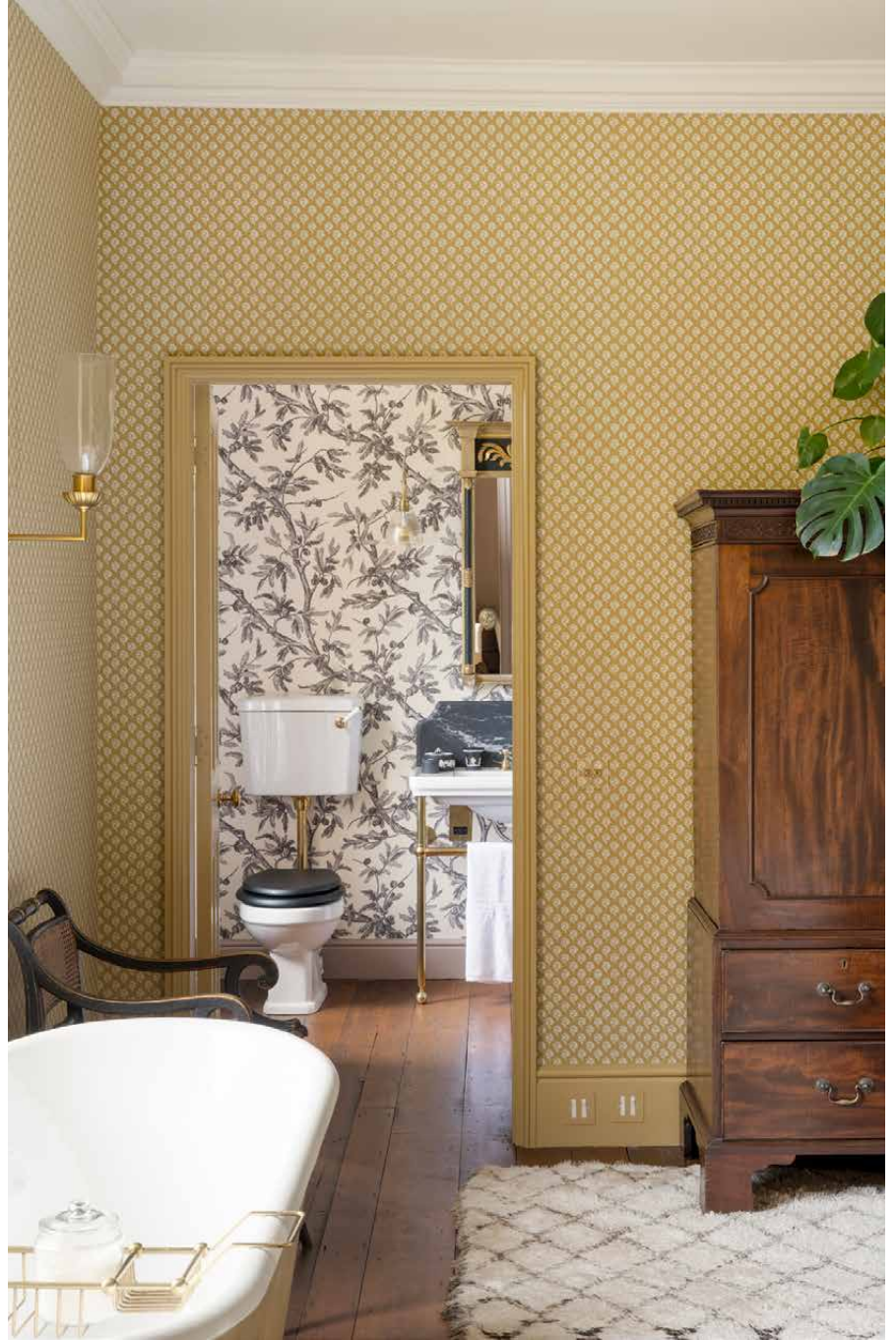




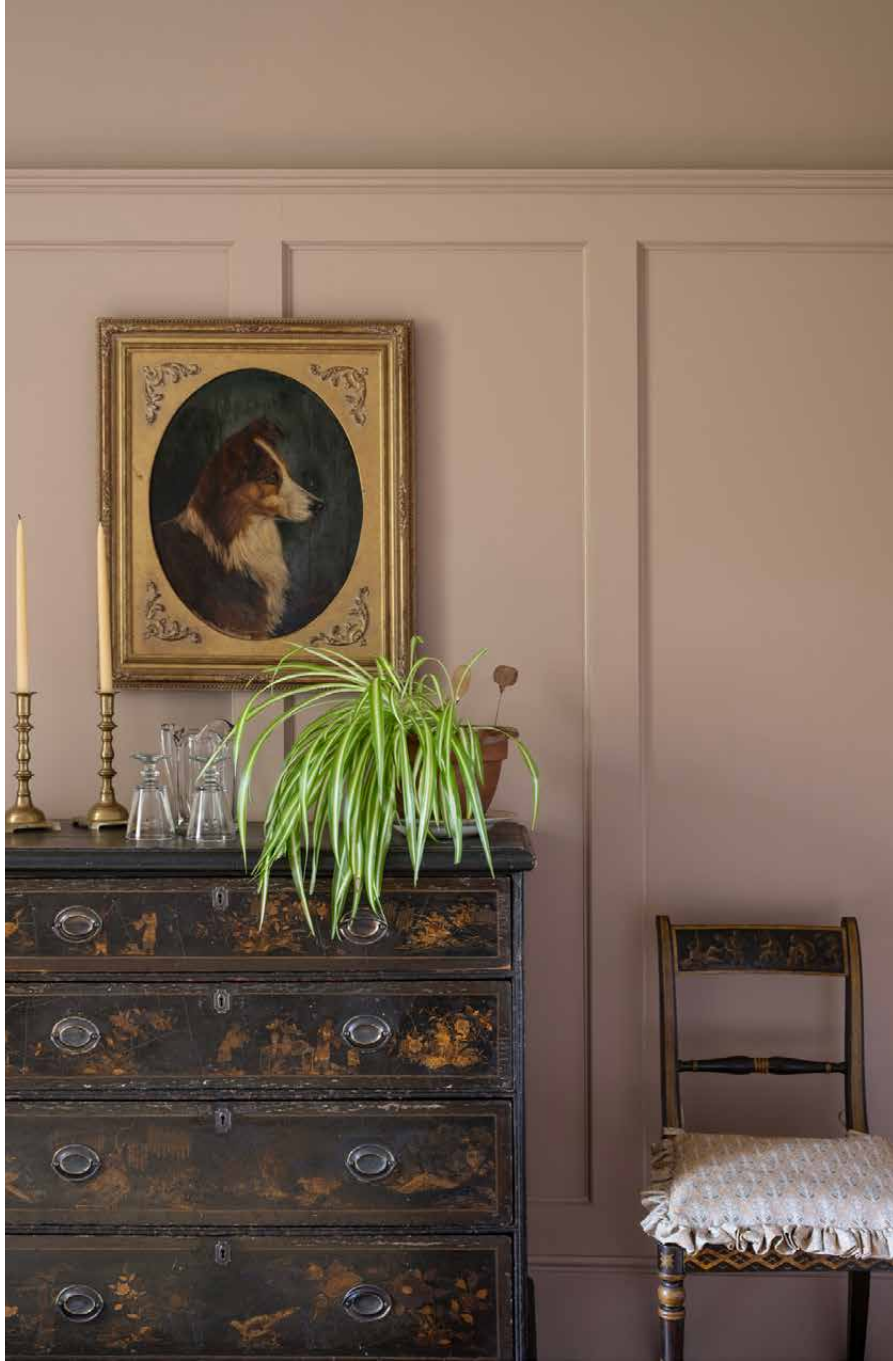






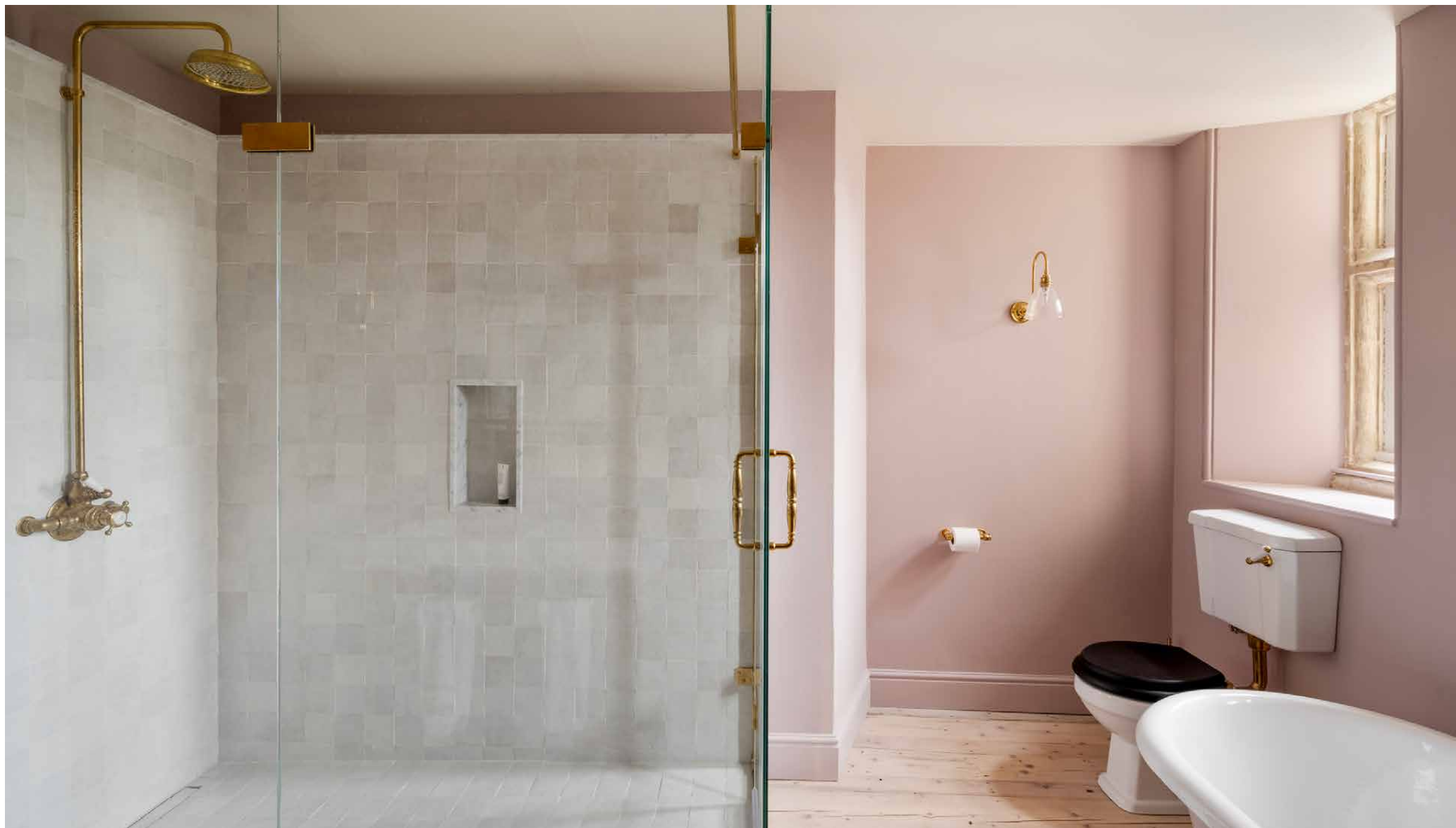












Wellness & leisure

The pool, with its warm stone walls and exposed timber beams, is a sanctuary of calm, flooded with sunlight through the French doors to the courtyard. Verdigris sculptures of the Seasons perched on pedestals lend the space a gallery-like ambiance, reflecting across the water. Post swim, enjoy a soothing massage therapy or holistic treatment.

For more upbeat activities, there's a games room set for rounds of billiards. Private and group yoga sessions can be organised, as well as personalised clay shooting lessons – ideal for those wanting to try their hand at quintessentially rural pursuits.



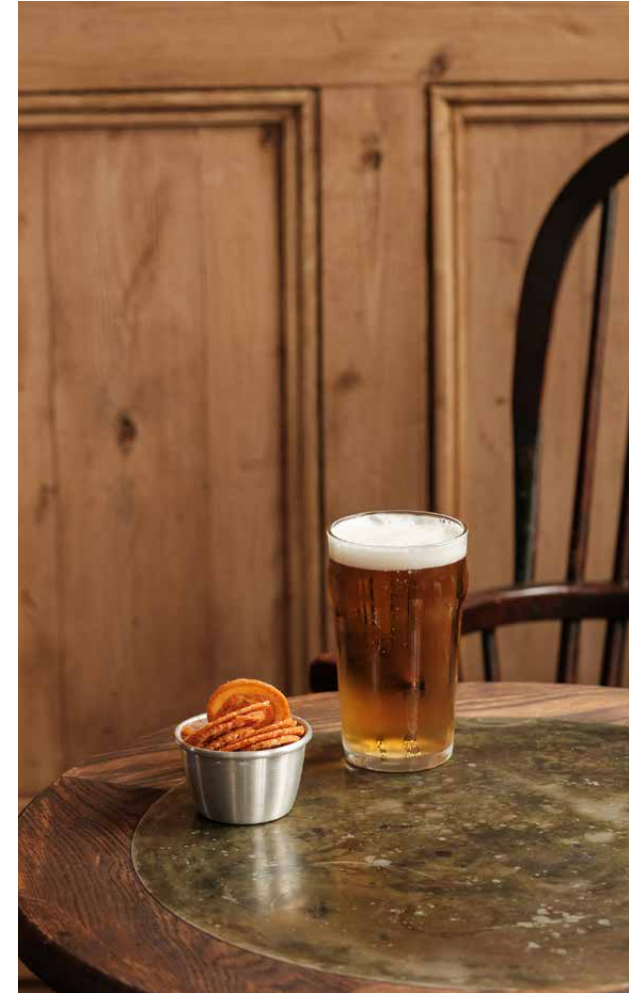
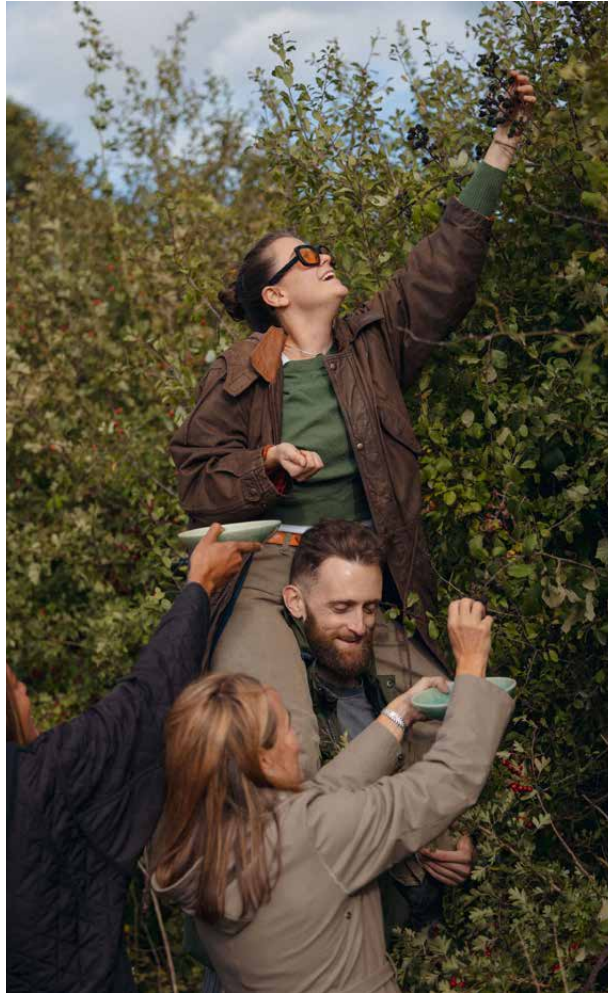




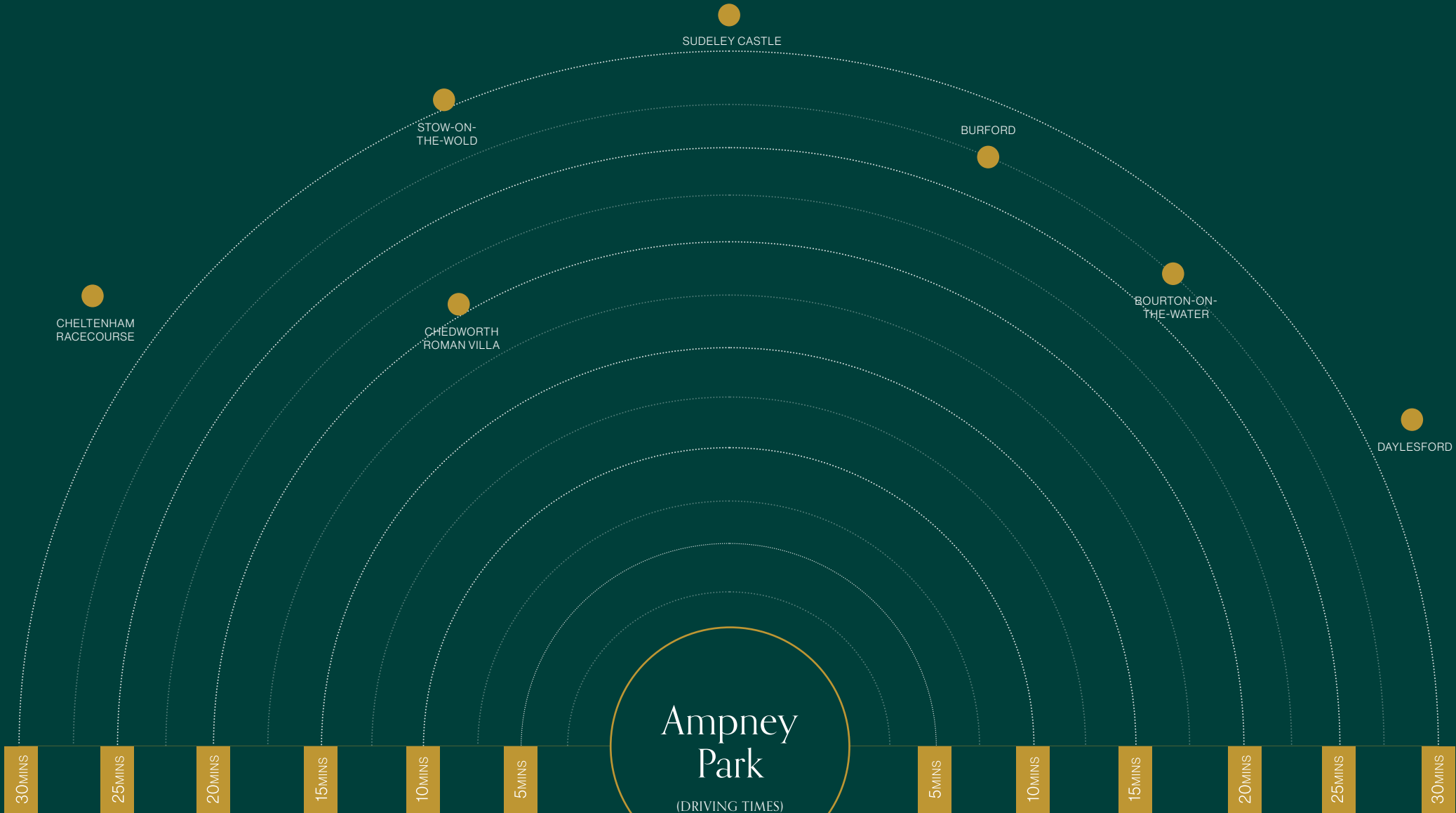
The surroundings

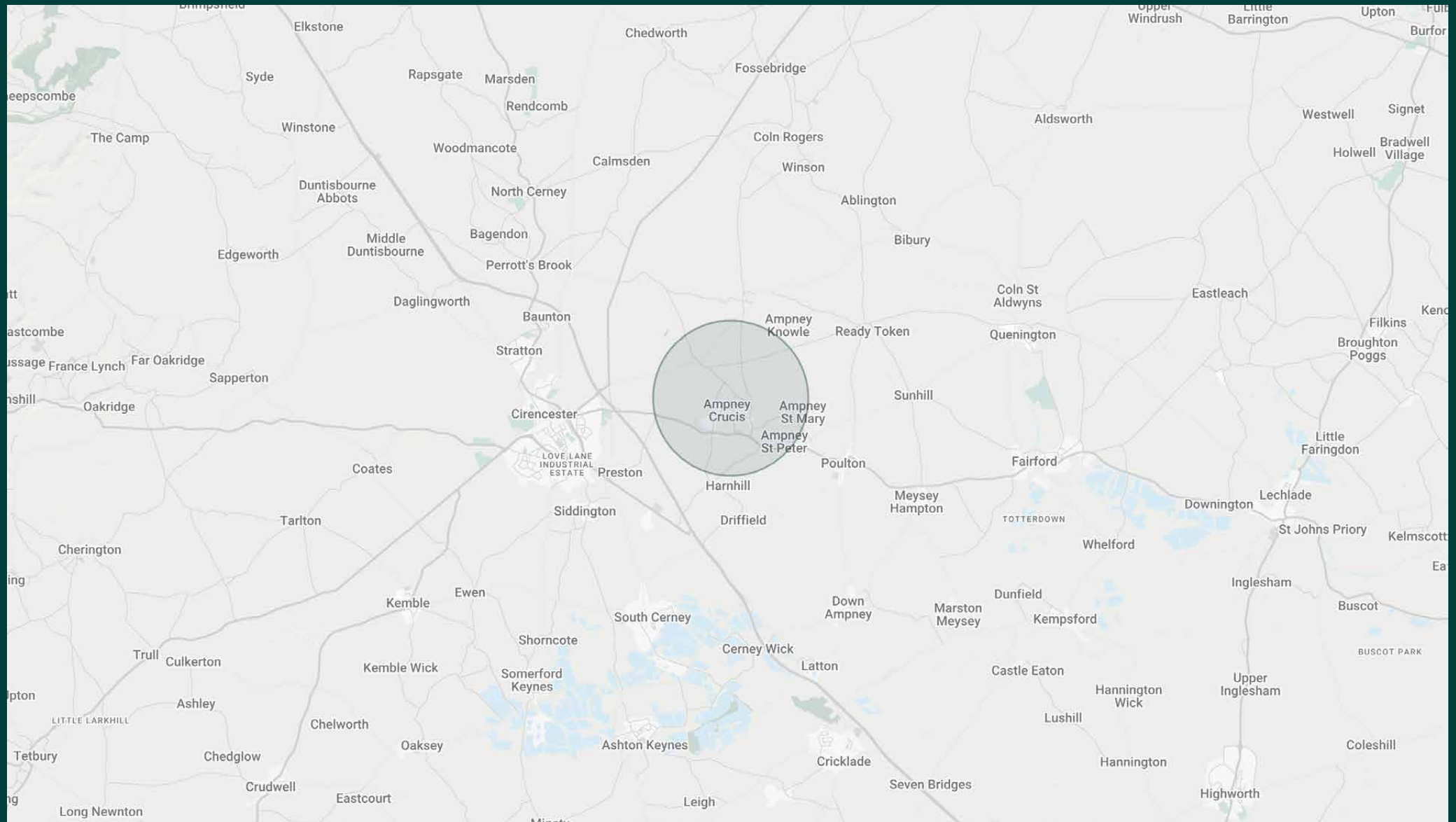
Ampney Crucis is a timeless village of honey-hued stone cottages, winding lanes and a historic church – offering a tranquil springboard to England's most picturesque region. Bibury, just 10 minutes away, is a similarly picture-perfect setting while nearby Cirencester – once the second most important city in Roman-era Britain after London – remains a hub of culture and history. For organic produce and artisan delicacies, don't miss the Charter Market, held each Monday and Friday. Cheltenham Racecourse is a short drive away, while polo enthusiasts will find the Cirencester and Beaufort Polo Clubs within easy reach.

Elsewhere, take a drive to Stow-on-the-Wold for its charming antique shops and tea rooms, before a visit to the iconic Daylesford Farm – with its organic shop, on-site restaurant and Bamford Spa. Finish the day with dinner at The Fox in Lower Oddington, a gastropub celebrated for its refined ambiance.
